For authors: Clean up your Google scholar profile

<https://scholar.google.com/> and sign in. Go to *my profile*, and check off the articles that you wrote. Add John Jay College and other affiliations if you like.

For authors: Get your ORCID and use it!

www.orcid.org Persistent identifiers help identify and disambiguate disparate items. Articles have DOIs, authors have ORCIDs. This REALLY helps the scholarly communications infrastructure (crossref, etc) Include your ORCID with your manuscript submissions.

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For readers: Use browser plug-ins to find Open Access articles

Unpaywall, *Open Access Button*, *Lazy Scholar*.

Kopernio looks very promising - the Library is investigating whether it will work for us; stay tuned!

Kopernio promises to find with one click subscription content as well as open access content.
